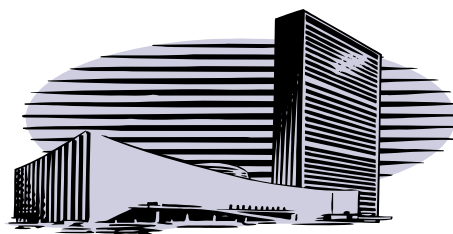
Lions Day at the UN

Come help us celebrate Lions Day with the United Nations on Friday March 14, 2003. This is a 25th annual event. Check in starts at 9am at the United Nations building in New York City, and the program begins at 10am. Please allow enough time to get through security.

The day program including a luncheon with the invited UN ambassadors costs \$100 per person, or \$85 for Leo students. The day program without lunch costs \$60 per person, or \$45 for Leo students.

The program includes a proclamation of Lions Day. At the close of the event, a 45 minute tour of the UN may be available at no additional charge, subject to security regulations.
