Our February 16th meeting was held jointly with the Willow Grove Lions Club. As you can see from the above photo, we had quite a turnout. More than a dozen members of the Willow Grove club came to visit us. We had quite a big turnout ourselves, almost ten members, which is far above average.

The primary purpose of the joint meeting was to sample the feelings regarding a possible merging of our two clubs. Many members of both clubs have wondered if such a merger would be possible, and if both clubs would be open to considering it.

Both clubs conducted their own business with the other club "eavesdropping". This way, we both got to know a little bit about how the other club operates, what activities are taking place, and what we might

be able to expect if we were to merge.

Most importantly, everyone in attendance was given the chance to take the floor and offer his opinions on the topic of merger. Although no official vote was taken, the general feeling was that a merger is considered a good thing, which will be beneficial to all, including the most important people involved: ***those whom we help.***

The feeling in the room was absolutely electric. Both clubs mingled and got along very well. Old friendships were renewed, and new ones formed.

Next Step: both clubs have agreed to meet among themselves and take a vote about merging. Once this vote has been made, we will conduct another joint meeting to review. During that meeting we will determine the next steps to take.

## Golf Outing Plea



Our annual golf outing will be taking place on Monday, July 31st at Commonwealth National Golf Course. Because of a lack of golfers to fill the roster in years' past, we are partnering with the Abington Lions Club as well as the Horsham/Willow Grove Chamber of Commerce. Hopefully with three organizations, we can fill up the golf roster this year.

We have one major problem: **MANPOWER.**

We are sorely lacking in people to perform some time-consuming tasks. If we had more people to help, I am sure we could canvas the area better and turn a very low-key golf outing into a major event.

Primarily, we need to contact Local Businesses, for three main reasons:

- ◆ **Enter Foursomes.** In years' past, local businesses have sent foursomes (or more) of their own people to golf in our outing. Horsham is growing, and I am sure we still have enough businesses to fill several foursomes. The problem is that we have no people with enough time to contact them and follow up.
- ◆ **Advertise in Program Book.** The MCAB has a program book each year, with two dozen (or more!) pages of advertisements. Each of those advertisements is income for the MCAB. If we sold small \$50 advertisements to 30 local businesses, imagine the proceeds! Again, we have no people who have adequate time.
- ◆ **Sponsor a Hole.** This should be the easiest thing to accomplish, because there are only 18 holes to sponsor. And, yet again, the major problem is manpower.

At times I have the energy and willpower to do all of this myself. What I do not have is the time. I completely understand that many of our members are in the same position, with job and family obligations preventing significant effort toward the golf outing.

This is a personal plea to some of our less active members, who are still on our rolls and still pay dues, to renew their commitment to the Lions. Every little bit counts. Even if you personally visit one or two local businesses, or just make a handful of phone calls.

Please coordinate with me so that I can ensure we don't double-call anyone. My contact info is on page 1 of this issue. Don't let this event, which has so much potential, continue to fade as it has been doing. — Andy Weiss
